Theme: Plants



Monday

Learning Goal: Children will begin to understand that all living things grow, change and go through life cycles.

Activity: Zip Bag Green House – Place a folded paper towel (or cotton balls) into a zip bag. Add 2-3 beans and enough water to moisten the paper towel or cotton. Zip the bag closed and tape to the window. Draw a picture in your journal every day to observe how your seed sprouts.

Tuesday

Learning Goal: Children will begin to identify characteristics of a variety of plants including physical attributes.

Activity: Seeds in Our Foods – Cut open several pieces of fruits or vegetables containing seeds and examine (optional: use the zoom lens on your phone for a closer look). Draw a picture of each fruit or vegetable and their seeds. Can you count how many in each?

Wednesday

Learning Goal: Children will begin to distinguish between living and non-living things.
